

WHO HONOURS HEALTH SPECIALISTS FOR THEIR WORK IN TOBACCO CONTROL

New Delhi, 31 May 2005: Each year, on the occasion of World No Tobacco Day, a number of eminent people working in the field of tobacco control are given public recognition by the World Health Organization. This year, one of two special awards accorded by the who Director 'General is to an activist from the South ñEast Asia Region.

Tobacco is the worldís single biggest preventable cause of death, claiming 5 million lives a year globally of which 1.2 million deaths occur in the countries of WHO's South ñEast Asia Region. The countries of the SEA Region are making progress in this area. Ten of the eleven Member States have signed the WHO Framework Convention on Tobacco Control (FCTC) and 9 countries are already Party to the convention. Much more needs to be done to prevent the needless deaths and ill health which are the outcome of tobacco consumption,î said Dr. Samlee Plianbanchang, Regional Director for WHOís South ñEast Asia Region. He added that although WHOís leadership with FCTC has brought tobacco legistation into force, health professionals, and civil society have a vital role to play, particularly in educating the youth, making them aware about the dangers of a lifestyle that promotes and glamorizes tobacco. Dr Samlee added that it is heartening to see the excellent leadership provided by several health professionals and NGOs in the Region, and congratulated the award winners on their noteworthy contribution and success.

The Director Generalis special award goes to Professor Nurul Islam of Bangladesh, who is a renowned physician of his country. He founded the first anti-tobacco organization, called ADHUNIK (We prevent smoking) and raised awareness against smoking across the country. As a well-known physician and a well-respected person in the country, he counseled his patients to stop smoking and motivated his colleagues and other health professionals to follow his example in providing counsel to their patients to stop smoking. He and his organization also played an important role in creating awareness about WHO FCTC and in encouraging the Government of Bangladesh to sign and ratify the Convention. Earlier this year, he actively joined other anti-tobacco NGOs in the campaign for the enactment of the tobacco control legislation.

The second special award has gone to Dr. Gines Gonzalez Garcia, Minister of Health, Argentina. Under Dr. Gonzalezís leadership, over the past two years, Argentina has strengthened the tobacco control infrastructure within the Ministry of Health. Dr. Gonzalez worked with the civil society to build support for tobacco control among the public and partnered with provincial and municipal politicians to promote smoke fifree environments.

আপনাদের মূল্যবান বৃক্তব্য আমাকে বহুকাল অতীতের দিকে টেনে নেয়। যে প্রতিষ্ঠানের কার্যকালের মাধ্যমে আজ আপনাদের নিকট অর্থাৎ বিশ্বস্বাস্থ্য সংস্থার নিকট সম্মানিত তার নাম 'আধূনিক' যার অর্থ 'আমরা ধুমপান নিবারণ করি'।

১৯৮৭ সালে এ প্রতিষ্ঠানের জন্ম। এ প্রতিষ্ঠানের নামকরণের পিছনে যাদের উৎসাহ এবং সহযোগিতা পেয়েছি তাঁরা হলেন- আমার শ্যালক চট্টগ্রাম বিশ্ববিদ্যালয়ের ভূতপূর্ব ভাইস চ্যান্সেলর এবং বর্তমানে নর্দান ইউনিভারসিটি-র ভাইস চ্যান্সেলর অধ্যাপক মোহাম্মদ আলী, তাঁর স্ত্রী অধ্যাপক খালেদা খানম, আমার মহধর্মিনী আনোয়ারা বেগম এবং বাল্যবন্ধুও পরবর্তীতে ভাইঝি জামাই অধ্যাপক ডা. আবদুল ওদুদ।

Indeed when I consider that utilizing his energy and personal income this humane personality in the arena of education and medicine has not done anything for himself and own family but has been sacrificing himself to the service and welfare of the people I get a deep self satisfaction for being fortunate enough to work as the President of the USTC Guardian Forum.

PROFESSOR NURUL ISLAM: HIS CONTRIBUTIONS TOWARDS ANTI-TOBACCO MOVEMENT IN BANGLADESH

Prof. Nurul Islam, IDA, D.Sc, FRCP, FRCPE, FAS, a National Professor of Bangladesh and the Founder Vice-Chancellor, University of Science & Technology Chittagong (USTC) is the architect and dreamer of a tobacco-free society in the country who first launched the anti-tobacco movement in the country. Prof. Islam has contributed most significantly towards the anti-tobacco movement in the country and he has established close link with many national and international organizations engaged in anti-tobacco movement.

In recognition of his contributions towards anti-tobacco movement he has received many awards from home and abroad. He is a recipient of the WHO Award twice in 1990 and again in 1992 for his contribution in anti-tobacco movement.

His contributions towards the anti-tobacco movement are furnished shortly as follows:

1. Establishment of ADHUNIK (We prevent Smokingi)

Professor Nurul Islam established ADHUNIK in the year 1987 and since then he is working relentlessly as Founder-President, ADHUNIK for tobacco-free Bangladesh. ADHUNIK is registered with the Department of Social Welfare, Government of Bangladesh having registration No. Dha-02021 dated 23 March 1987. It has 78 branches all over the country.

2. Establishment of CAT ñ an important event

Coalition Against Tobacco (CAT) was established in 2000 by the initiative of Prof Islam of which he is the founding Chief Advisor. This is a milestone towards anti-tobacco movement in the country. CAT members include 13 registered organizations with the aims and objectives to fight against tobacco jointly under the banner of the ADHUNIK.

3. Tobacco News ñ a unique publication

This is a monthly publication of ADHUNIK and CAT jointly since July, 2001. Prof. Islam is the initiator and acting as the Chairman of the Editorial Board, Tobacco News. The copies are distributed among 78 branches of ADHUNIK, different health centers, clubs, organizations and individuals. Report from various readers indicates that public awareness is on the rise.

4. Voyage of Discovery

"The ship could not enter the Bangladesh territory and had to cancel their activities in the country through an injunction by the High Court. This was the first legal victory in the country against the tobacco giant. Prof Islam's contribution in this respect is praiseworthy. "The case was conducted by Barrister Omar Saadat.

5. USTC ñ A Smoke-free Campus

University of Science & Technology Chittagong (USTC) located in Foy's Lake, Chittagong and founded by Prof Islam is a tobacco-free campus.

6. WHO Concept of TFI/FCTC

Prof Islam is a true follower of the above concepts. His love and respect for the WHO concepts on tobacco are reflected through his various works viz: i. Press conference on WNTD them/FCTC, ii. Articles on WNTD theme, FCTC, TFI and other concepts of the WHO; iii. Congratulatory note to the Honible DG, WHO; iv. Publicizing the WHO concepts of tobacco in various publications of ADHUNIK/CAT. All these contributed greatly in anti-tobacco movement in the country.

7. Tobacco and Religion

Bangladesh being an Islamic country has unique opportunity of controlling tobacco through teaching and implementation of Islamic principles through Imams of mosques and religious leaders. Prof Islam has introduced the strategy in the country having impact on controlling tobacco in the country.

8. Increase of Tax

In his several articles Prof Islam emphasized the need for increase of tax on tobacco. To quote Professor Islam, ëTobacco taxation helps government to earn revenue and a boon for the poorí. This is now a popular concept among the health scientists and the economic planners.

9. Enactment of Law

Enactment of law for prohibiting cultivation, manufacturing, import and consumption of tobacco and production of tobacco-based products is the demand of Prof Islam from the very beginning of the concept. It is a matter of pleasure that Tobacco Control Law will be enacted in Bangladesh soon for which ADHUNIK extends heart-felt thanks to all the members of the Parliament, particularly the Honible Health Minister for his bold step in the 56th World Health Assembly which unanimously adopted the WHO Framework Convention on Tobacco Control.

10. Participation in all the international Conferences on Tobacco or Health

Prof Islam has participated in almost all the international conferences on tobacco or health and presented scientific papers there. He has humbly tried to project WHO concept on tobacco in the said conferences.

11. Anti-tobacco articles/publications

He has to his credit over 100 anti-tobacco articles published in different national dailies and in the international journals. The book entitled iTobacco Control in Bangladesh: The Man Behindî is a compilation of anti-tobacco articles of Prof Islam which has received appreciation from World anti-tobacco leaders.

Contribution of Prof Nurul Islam, Founder-President, ADHUNIK over the years is reflected from the following:

- i. The President house and the Prime Minister's Secretariat are tobacco-free areas.
- ii. All conferences, meetings and cinema halls are tobacco-free.
- iii. Electronic media are free tobacco advertisements.
- iv. Domestic flights and air-conditioned transports and AC compartments of the railways are tobacco-free.
- v. Tax on tobacco has been increased.
- vi. Alternative farming has been introduced in many tobacco fields.
- vii. School textbooks contain articles on ill effects of tobacco.
- viii. Radio and Television arrange different programmes depicting harmful effects of tobacco.

In the international field ADHUNIK/Prof Islam has maintained close liason with the following:

The WHO-Regional office and headquarters through distribution of leaflets, posters, booklets and dissemination of other information relating to anti-tobacco movement.

WHO lauded the activities of Prof Islam/ADHUNIK.

American Cancer Society has appreciated the activities of ADHUNIK. IATH, Globalink and Quit.

ADHUNIKís/Prof Islamís commitments and contributions to the continuation of tobacco-free programme are reflected through its/his various anti-tobacco activities including research and publications.

Prof. N. Islam, my teacher in Dhaka Medical College & Hospital, was a man of knowledge, proved by his bedside teaching & lecture classes. His bedside clinical teaching to us was a practical approach towards diagnosis. His award stemmed from his organization ADHUNIK launched in 1987 which is really praise worthy as smoking is more dangerous than an atom bomb since smoking kills millions of human beings in the world during peace time as a slow poison without any blast or sound.


